Theodore R. Belfor, DDS, is a Senior Certified Instructor for the International Association of Orthodontics and the inventor of the Homeblock™ appliance. He speaks internationally and has been published in many peer reviewed journals. In this session he will discuss craniofacial development of adult patients through epigenetic response to a removable orthopedic/orthodontic appliance, the Homeblock™. Participants will learn how the face ages and how a clinician can arrest and reverse the premature aging of the face, how the airway ages and what can be done for upper airway resistance syndrome, and a simple protocol to reduce respiratory effort related arousals.

10:30 AM – 12:00 Noon **Guiding Craniofacial Growth and Development from Primary Dentition: Are Malocclusions and TMJ Preventable?**



German O. Ramirez-Yanez, DDS, is Assistant Professor at Faculty of Dentistry, University of Manitoba in Winnipeg, Canada, and has more than 20 years of experience treating malocclusions at an early age with a functional approach. He has published more than 20 articles in peer reviewed journals. His book, *Early Treatment of Malocclusions: Prevention and Interception in Primary Dentition*, was recently released. In this session, he will present insights of craniofacial growth and development and the current scientific basis for preventing, intercepting and treating malocclusions at an early age. Participants will learn to identify malocclusions and TMJ problems in children, understand particular techniques designed for treatment of malocclusions and prevention of TMDs at an early age, and be able to advise parents on how to improve oral health and craniofacial growth and development in their children.

1:30 PM – 2:30 PM **Replicating the Patient's Final Orthotic Position in Stage Two Reconstruction**



Jack L. Haden, DDS, was one of the founders of the Society of Occlusal Studies and of the American Academy of Craniofacial Pain. He has taught more than 150 courses on occlusion and TMD dysfunction in countries around the world. He was an Associate Professor at the University of Missouri in the middle-to-late 1970s. In this presentation, he will provide finite, step-by-step illustrations of a Phase II crown and bridge reconstruction of a patient who could not tolerate 1/10 of a mm change in orthotic vertical. Semi-adjustable articulators are readily available and you will learn where to find them. Participants will also learn how to maintain the patient's vertical throughout the temporization phase.

2:30 PM – 3:30 PM **Treatment of the Motor Component of Movement Disorder Patients**



Brendan C. Stack, DDS, has limited his practice in Northern Virginia to orthodontics, craniofacial pain and TMJ disorders for 45 years. The Tufts University 2003 recipient of the "Lifetime Achievement Award," for his years of contribution to the field, he has published peer reviewed literature on the long-term results of his treatment procedures. He has lectured extensively around the world and dedicated his career to providing patients and professionals with the information they need to understand craniofacial pain and TMJ disorders. The focus of this session is on movement disorder patients, whether the disorder be Dystonia, Tourette's Syndrome, Torticollis, Parkinson's Disease or TMJ internal derangement documented by MR imaging (which has been overlooked or misdiagnosed). Participants will learn how to diagnose the presence of internal derangements in motor disorder patients, construction of a mandibular intraoral orthotic for the specific treatment of movement disorder patients and long-term management of the movement disorder patient after appliance delivery.

8:00 AM – 9:30 AM **Building Balanced Faces... Breaking Rules and Establishing a New Paradigm**



William M. Hang, DDS, became dissatisfied in 1981 with the results of traditional orthodontic care and began a continuing education odyssey – which has never ended – to find ways of achieving better facial balance. A local, national and international speaker on Biobloc Orthotropics®, tooth eruption and impaction, facial esthetics, and the effect of orthodontics on the TMJ and airway, he has done pioneering work on converting unfavorable vertical growth to favorable horizontal growth and in reopening previous orthodontic extraction spaces to eliminate pain, OSA and to improve facial balance. This presentation will focus on the reasons to develop the face forward in all age groups and how doing so affects the airway and tongue space. It will be shown that this is the diametric opposite of much traditional orthodontic treatment which is retractive in nature and can reduce the tongue space and airway. Participants will learn that a new paradigm for orthodontic treatment is absolutely essential to providing treatment which enhances TMJ health and might enhance longevity by potentially preventing OSA in the future, that a new paradigm of forward development of both the maxilla and mandible makes total sense from an esthetic, anthropologic and functional perspective, and that proven techniques with a long track record of success are available to accomplish the goal of optimizing facial balance and airway in all age groups.

9:30 AM – 10:30 AM **Behavioral, Psychological, Physiological and Genetic Underpinnings of Chronic Temporomandibular Muscle and Joint Disorder (TMJD): The Initial Findings of the OPPERA Study**



Joel D. Greenspan, PhD, has been conducting pain research for more than 30 years and is currently Professor and Chair of the Department of Neural and Pain Sciences at the University of Maryland Dental School. In this session, he will describe the first set of findings from the multi-center OPPERA study (Orofacial Pain: Prospective Evaluation and Risk Assessment). These findings examine the risk factors for people with TMD in many different domains: physiological, psychological, and behavioral. Participants will learn that there are many different factors associated with TMD, that TMD is associated with a generalized pain sensitivity (not just restricted to symptomatic body regions) and that specific genetic polymorphisms are associated with increased risk of TMD.

Brian Rotenberg, MD, has had extensive training in Otolaryngology, highly specialized surgery of the head and neck, and has been certified by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. He has also completed advanced nasal surgery training in Australia and developed a particular expertise in treating disorders of the nose and sinuses as well as snoring and sleep problems. He has been recognized with multiple awards for his work, presented at many international conferences and been widely published in scientific journals. In this session, he will focus on surgical management of sleep apnea, as well as provide an overview of apnea in general. Participants will gain an understanding of the role of surgery in treating sleep apnea, the methods both old and new in terms of surgical treatment, and gain an appreciation for the problem of sleep apnea in society.

Beck, MD, completed an internship in general surgery at the Cincinnati Medical School and then completed a sports medicine fellowship at Georgia's Hughston Medical Center, which was the first sports medicine program in the world. An orthopedic surgeon and neurobiologist, he sees patients daily and reports that almost half of his patients have undiagnosed TMD/TMJ disorders! More than 20 years ago he combined all of his areas of medical expertise and developed a new method of diagnosing chronic pain, which he calls "The PANE Process," for Practical Application of Neuropostural Evaluations. Participants in this session will learn how to apply his methods – both before and after treatment – to reach to reach a more successful outcome. Participants will also learn to decide when they need to add an orthopedic surgeon to their treatment team.
