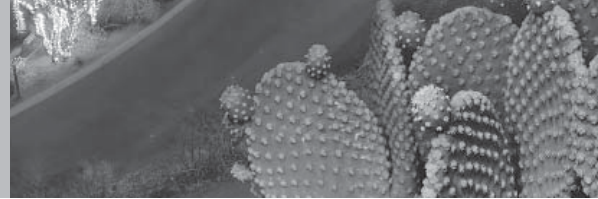

**JOHN MEW**

*BDS Lond; LDS. RCS. Eng; MFGDP. (UK); M.Orth.RCS. Edin*

*London School of Facial Orthotropics*

Trained in Orthognathic surgery, Dr. Mew moved to the specialty of orthodontics in 1965. Since then, he has been developing non-surgical methods of correcting unattractive vertical growth in children's faces. In 1987, he successfully challenged the Minister of Health, opening the way for a range of functional and orthopaedic techniques in the UK. A practicing clinician, Dr. Mew's research interests are in the etiology of malocclusion and the guidance of facial growth.



**SHOKRI A. WAHIB**

An AACP Fellow and Academy member since 2000, Dr. Wahib has a special interest in TMJ treatment and dental sleep medicine.
